Cerebral Palsy (CP): Children who have mild CP may toe-walk because their calf muscle(s) (gastrocnemius) are affected by the CP and are spastic. The spasticity causes the calf muscles to continuously contract and pull the foot so that the child is pointing their toes in sitting or is up on their toes in standing. Over time
